♪ BAND PRIDE ♪

Positive group pride, as well as spirit, may be defined as a combination of attitude and enthusiasm when working for and with the band. Some factors that build this type of spirit and pride are cooperation, individual and group performances, proficiency on one's instrument, and personal enthusiasm. Self-motivation and goodwill are contagious and are a vital part of good spirit. It must be remembered that at **all times** the band is representative of WJHS and the Waterloo Community School District.

♪ GENERAL RULES ♪

Improper behaviour is a matter of choice. No one makes someone else do something. Junior High School students are expected to accept the responsibility for their actions, regardless of the consequences. There are only two rules in the band room for my 7th and 8th graders and they are:

BE RESPECTFUL and BE RESPONSIBLE

Since you are in Junior High, by now you know what you need to do and what not to do. Proper classroom behaviour should have already been learned by each and every one of you. Here's a helpful hint: Think before you act. If you are afraid of being caught, chances are, you shouldn't be doing it.

♪ CONSEQUENCES ♪

As all situations are as unique as the students involved, all behaviour issues will be dealt with on an individual basis. I have an *immense* amount of patience, so if I have reached the point to speak with you in private or contact your parents, you should know it is a **big deal**!!

♪ EVERY-DAY REWARDS ♪

- 1) Student-run rehearsals (students will pick the pieces to play for that day or what they want to learn about).
- 2) Random question session.
- 3) Music-related treat.

♪ ATTENDANCE ♪

Attendance is expected at **all** band performances (formal and informal). You (the students) will be given a schedule of the upcoming events at the beginning of the school year. I suggest that you write them down in your planner. The schedule should be kept in your binder. Any student absent from any performance for any reason will need to do a Make Up Assignment.

I understand that accidents and emergencies happen. I must receive a written note from your parent/guardian *explaining your absence*. The decision of whether your absence is excused or unexcused will be carefully considered by me and all decisions will be final. **Examples of excused absences** include but are not limited to illness, family emergency, and school-related conflict (must discuss with Mrs. Shaheen-Hoke *first*). Also please note that if you miss a performance due to illness, you must have been absent on a surrounding school day for it to be excused. **Examples of unexcused absences** include but are not limited to birthdays or other parties, homework, non-school related conflicts, and guinea pig just had guinea piglets. Any unexcused absences will prevent you from being eligible for any band incentives.

*Keep in mind that being a member of a band is **not** the same as being the member of an English class. Your band mates are depending on **you** to play **your** part. Please don't let them down!*

♪ INDIVIDUAL PRACTICE ♪

Individual practice is required for success in this band. This can include working in the band book, on band music, solos, ensembles, tryouts, and assignments of private teachers (provided the Band assignment is done). *While the length of time the student practices is important, the efficiency with which the student practices is even more important.* If students are not working toward a particular objective while practicing, they may be wasting their time. Parents/guardians will need to be patient and understanding as their student practices toward certain goals. *If a student sounds great the entire time he/she is practicing, they are working on the wrong material!* Please see Mrs. Shaheen-Hoke for more challenging material if needed. I've got it.

♪ GRADING POLICY ♪

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Everyone will have one 20-minute lesson/week. - Graded on: Improvement, Effort, and Preparation (see Lesson Rubric in binder). - Lowest grade will be dropped at the end of the quarter. 	
Practice Sheets	20%
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Appropriate sheet must have signature of parent/guardian to be valid. - Everyone will turn in minutes on <u>Wednesday</u>. If forgotten, the student will receive Oops #1 and the minutes are due the next day for full credit. Oops#2 will receive ½ credit for minutes turned in a day late. Oops #3 will receive ⅓ credit, etc. <i>If the student is absent on Wednesday, minutes need to be turned in the day the student returns to school to be accepted.</i> - 8th Grade: Oops! #1 = -10 pts, Oops! #2 = -20 pts, Oops! #3 = -30 pts, etc. - Lowest grade will be dropped at the end of the quarter. - Excessive failure to turn in minutes may affect eligibility for band incentives. - It is expected that you take your instrument home (AND PRACTICE) as often as possible. You will be expected to take them home to practice every weekend and/or when there are two or more consecutive days off.

♪ BASIC PROCEDURES ♪

What Should I Bring to EVERY Class?

You should bring your instrument, pencil, organized binder, book, agenda, ticket (if applicable), smile, and a willingness to learn and grow as a musician.

Lesson Procedure

Most of you will be pulled out of 20 minutes of your PE (Health, etc.) class for your weekly lesson. Here's how we do that:

- 1) Get everything you need for your band lesson and take it with you to your class (you won't be allowed to go to your locker).
- 2) Go to your regularly scheduled class first and check in.
- 3) Either head straight to band after that (if your lesson is in the first part of class) or WATCH THE CLOCK and leave about three minutes before your lesson starts.
- 4) Go to band. Woot.
- 5) After your lesson (especially if your lesson is first in the hour), go DIRECTLY back to class. Do not stop by your locker, do not go to the restroom, do not pass GO, etc.

You are expected to participate in your PE class before/after your band lesson. This means being sure to have tennis shoes on your feet for PE, etc.

Resale Items (or When Should I Change My Reed?)

For a nominal fee, I provide reeds, oil, grease, and other handy items that almost everyone is expected to have in their cases.

- Reeds should be changed at least every month and you should have at least three in your case at all times.
- All brass and reed players should have appropriate oils and greases in their cases. Brass: All slides should be able to move. Period. If they don't move, it's your responsibility to take the instrument to be repaired by a professional.

Leaving the Classroom

Permission to leave the room will only be granted for TRUE emergencies. This is because you are a vital part of the class and we need your awesomeness in the room! If a true emergency arises, just let me know and grab a pass!

♪ BASIC PROCEDURES - CONTINUED ♪

Formal Performances - All absentees will complete a Make Up Assignment.

These are our sit-down concerts including the Winter Concert, Clinic Concert, and Spring Concert. Students are to wear school-appropriate dressy clothes with solid white on top and solid black on bottom (including socks and shoes). Students not in uniform will lose points off of the performance grade.

Informal Performances - All absentees will complete a Make Up Assignment.

These are our athletic- and community-supporting performances including all parades, pep band gigs, and our pregame performance. Students are to wear their current band shirt, denim on bottom (school-appropriate shorts or jeans depending on weather), and tennis shoes with white socks. Students not in uniform will lose points off of the performance grade.

As Per the Student Handbook

Due to limited space in various Fine Arts classes as well as performance commitments throughout the year, students will only be allowed to change their Fine Arts option (Band/Chorus) to the Encore Wheel during the first five (5) academic days of the school year. A Class Drop Request Form must be completed and signed by student, parent, instructor, and administrator. Please note that completion of the Class Drop Request Form is not a guarantee that the student will be removed from class. However, if the student is unable to meet class behaviour requirements, this policy will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
